

1. Introduction


Under an agreement with the Alabama Department of Transportation, the South Central Alabama Development Commission (SCADC) has continued a rural transportation planning program for the 2024-2025 fiscal year, covering the period from October 1, 2024 through September 30, 2025. The study area for the South Central Alabama Rural Transportation Planning Process includes the six counties, and the 26 municipalities located therein, that are served by the SCADC, in their entirety. These counties are Bullock, Butler, Crenshaw, Lowndes, Macon and Pike Counties. (See the map on the following page.) There are no urban areas in these counties. The South Central Alabama area is served by two interstate highways, six federal highways, and 20 major state highways. These highways offer both north-south and east-west regional access as well as access throughout the South Central Alabama area.

The purpose of the ongoing program is to assist the Alabama Department of Transportation in carrying out a Statewide Transportation Planning Process, as outlined in the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act 11201, 23 USC 134 and 135, by establishing a continuous and on-going rural transportation planning process that will aid in the identification of rural transportation needs and issues of the South Central Alabama region. During the FY 2025 Rural Transportation Planning Program, rural transportation stakeholders and committees identified types of rural transportation priority projects that are common across the South Central Alabama Region. Citizen stakeholders in each county, however, identified specific rural transportation needs, issues and safety concerns.

Public involvement in the rural transportation planning program in South Central Alabama region continues to be a challenging, yet critically important, part of the process. Since the beginning of the South Central Alabama Rural Transportation Planning Process in 2006, the number of rural transportation stakeholders increased from 439 stakeholders in 2007 to 687 stakeholders during the 2025 fiscal year. During the 2024-2025 fiscal year, the following five public involvement activities were conducted by the South Central Alabama Development Commission:

- One Steering Committee Meeting;
- Two South Central Alabama Development Commission Board Meetings;
- ALDOT Statewide Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan Update Meeting Notification
- Rural Transportation Stakeholder Input
- Notasulga Comprehensive Plan Transportation


The South Central Alabama Rural Transportation Region



2. Committee and Board Meetings

A joint meeting of the South Central Alabama Rural Transportation Steering Committee and Advisory Committees was scheduled for Wednesday, September 17, 2025. The meeting was held at the South Central Alabama Development Commission office, located in Montgomery, Alabama. Steering and Advisory Committee members were notified by e-mail with a meeting notice. Additionally, the general public was notified of the Steering Committee meeting by newspaper advertisement in six newspapers in the region, by email, and by postcards. The following items are included for the Steering Committee meeting as documentation of the public involvement process followed in conducting the South Central Alabama Rural Transportation Steering Committee meetings: meeting notice, advertisement, meeting flyer, meeting agenda, meeting minutes (which includes attendance), and all meeting material that was distributed.

The South Central Alabama Rural Transportation Steering Committee is comprised of 22 members representing all six counties, the Alabama Department of Transportation, and the South Central Alabama Region. (7) Steering Committee Meeting Minutes

SCADC Rural Transportation Planning Organization Steering Committee Meeting Minutes: September 17, 2025

The 25th meeting of the South Central Alabama Development Commission Rural Transportation Planning Program Steering Committee was held on September 17, 2025, at 10:30 AM at the offices of South Central Alabama Development Commission in Montgomery, Alabama. Mayor Rheba Knox, Town of Franklin, chaired the meeting and called the meeting to order. Roll was called for the Steering Committee and a quorum was declared present. A copy of the attendance roster is attached and made a part of these minutes. Mayor Knox asked members to review the minutes from the September 12, 2024 and September 21, 2023 Steering Committee meetings that were included in their agenda package. Mr. George Sims made a motion to approve both sets of minutes as presented; Mr. Tyson Howard seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Business

During the Communications and Updates portion of the meeting, committee members took the opportunity to update everyone on transportation activities in their respective areas. Following the county updates, Ms. Delaney presented public involvement conducted for the ALDOT Statewide Bicycle and Transportation Plan Update in October 2024. Ms. Delaney then presented four documents for review by the Steering Committee: the SCARPO FY 2026 Work Program; the SCARPO Guiding Principles; the SCARPO Public Involvement Plan; and the 2025 Human Services Coordinated Transportation Plan Update. Ms. Tracy Delaney stated that the FY24 Work Program Budget will remain level at \$74,156 so that SCADC can continue to assist ALDOT with public involvement efforts. There were no suggestions for amendments to either the Guiding Principles, the Public Involvement Plan, or the 2025 Human Services Coordinated Transportation Plan Update. Resolutions were presented to approve the FY26 Work Program, Guiding Principles the Public Involvement Plan, and the 2025 Human Services Coordinated Transportation Plan Update. Following the review, Mr. George Sims made a motion to adopt Resolution 25-01 to approve the South Central Alabama Rural Transportation Planning Organization FY26 Work Program; Resolution 25-02 to Approve the South Central Alabama Rural Transportation Planning Organization Guiding Principles; Resolution 25-03 to Approve the South Central Alabama Planning Organization Public Involvement Plan; and Resolution 25-04 to Approve the 2025 Human Services Coordinated Transportation Plan Update. Mr. Tyson Howard seconded the motion to adopt all four resolutions. The motion carried. Copies of the resolutions are included.

Mr. David Hutchison, of Butler County Commission for Economic Development, made a presentation on how RPO funds were used to conduct a traffic impact study for a new drive-thru restaurant in Georgiana, Butler County. Then Ms. Delaney presented the transportation component of the Notasulga Comprehensive Plan. In the last item of business, Ms. Delaney presented the list of transportation needs and issues that had been identified through the 2025 Rural Transportation Planning Process. The lists were reviewed and updated by committee members during the meeting.

Comments, Next Meeting Date and Adjourn

With there being no further items for discussion, Mr. Sims made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Mr. DeShazo provided a second. With no further comments, Mayor Peavy adjourned the meeting at 12:54 PM.

WHEREAS, the South Central Alabama Development Commission, serving as staff to the RPO is required to provide guidance to local governments in conducting the non-metropolitan planning process as a cooperative effort with the Alabama Department of Transportation as established in the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking May 2021; and

WHEREAS, the South Central Alabama Development Commission has prepared a FY 2024 Work Program outlining the tasks necessary to accomplish the goals of the cooperative planning process and the Rural Planning Organization; and

WHEREAS, the FY 2026 RPO Work Program has been duly reviewed, discussed, and adopted by the South Central Alabama Development Commission Board of Directors; and




WHEREAS, an annual review and discussion of the *Guiding Principles of the South Central Alabama Rural Transportation Planning Organization* was conducted by the South Central Alabama Rural Transportation Planning Organization Steering Committee in a regular meeting on Wednesday, September 17, 2025.


upon to complete the Memorandum of Agreement by both parties.

HUMAN SERVICES COORDINATED TRANSPORTATION PLAN 2024 UPDATE

To be eligible for Federal Transit Administration (FTA) program funds, including but not limited to Section 5310 (Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities), proposed projects must be derived from a locally-developed human services coordinated transportation plan (HSCTP). Therefore, it is essential that all public transportation providers participate in this planning process, as that is a part of the eligibility for transportation funds, such as senior vans or busses. The plan will identify barriers to transportation, as well as a prioritized list of strategies for increased coordination among both public and private transportation providers and opportunities for increased transportation services.

The flyer that has been distributed shows concentrations of population with high transportation needs based on five target population groups:

- Senior citizens,
- Persons with a disability,
- Unemployed persons,
- High poverty levels, and
- Households with no vehicle available.


Not surprisingly, those target population groups are often found in the parts of our region that have the lowest population density, which only increases the need. The next step is to identify the most common transportation destinations, as well as, the most common times of the day when transportation is needed. We will soon be emailing a survey link to help with gathering that information and will be conducting meetings with transportation stakeholders to review and develop strategies for increased coordination of transportation services. The purpose of the South Central Alabama Regional Human Services Coordinated Transportation Plan is to identify transportation needs and coordinate opportunities, particularly among publicly funded transportation providers. Additionally, the plan looks at opportunities for increased coordination with transportation providers that receive other program funds or are privately operated. The final plan will identify transportation barriers and provide prioritized strategies to improve public transportation services. Areas with high transportation needs were determined based on data collected for target population groups: elderly, disabled, economically disadvantaged, and unemployed persons, as well as households with no vehicle available. Draft Minutes of the Board of Directors' Meeting**

August 24, 2025

The Board of Directors of the South Central Alabama Development Commission (SCADC) met at 8:30AM on Wednesday, August 27, 2025 at the office of the SCADC, located at 5900 Carmichael Place, Montgomery, Alabama. Members present were: George Davis, Mayor Lawrence (Tony) Haygood, David Hutchison, David Padgett, Melissa Sanders, and Probate Judge Will Tate. Staff and contractors present included Tracy Delaney (Delaney Consultant Services, Inc.), Tyson Howard, Ashton Hutchison, Jennifer Kilpatrick, Anna Lee, James Paterson, Jacob Poole, and Beth Rosser.

In the absence of Chair Mildred Whittington, Vice Chair Melissa Sanders called the meeting to order at 8:34 AM and James Paterson provided the invocation. The minutes of the February 19, 2025 meeting were presented. David Padgett made a motion to approve the minutes; David Hutchison provided a second. Motion approved unanimously.

In the absence of Treasurer Jackie Thomas, Tyson Howard presented the agency financial report for the quarter ending June 30, 2025. Mr. Hutchison made a motion to approve the financial report as presented; Mayor Haygood provided a second. The motion was unanimously approved. Next, Mr. Howard presented the FY 2026 Annual Budget of approximately \$7.25 million, adding that the budget did include merit raises in response to a question from Ms. Sanders. Mayor Haygood made a motion to approve the FY 2026 Budget, as presented; Mr. Padgett provided a second. The motion was unanimously approved.

Tracy Delaney presented a transportation report, stating that there are three resolutions for transportation programs to be reviewed. The first was a resolution to enter into an agreement with the Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) relating to a Cooperative Process for Rural Transportation Planning. Judge Tate made a motion to approve the resolution to enable the SCADC to enter into an agreement with ALDOT to conduct a rural transportation planning cooperative process; George Davis provided a second. The resolution was unanimously approved. The second resolution was to adopt the FY 2026 Work Program for the South Central Alabama Rural Transportation Planning Program (RPO). Ms. Delaney stated that the program budget for the upcoming year is the same as the previous year at \$74,156. Mr. Hutchison provided an example of a project just completed in Georgiana with RPO funds. Past projects in other communities were also discussed and Board Members were asked to contact Mr. Howard or Ms. Delaney if they had any transportation planning needs. Mr. Hutchison made a motion to approve the resolution for the South Central Alabama RPO FY 2026 Work Program; Mr. Padgett seconded the motion. The resolution was unanimously approved. Next, Ms. Delaney presented an executive summary of the 2025 South Central Alabama Human Services Coordinated Transportation Plan (HSCTP) that must be updated every five years as a guideline for rural transportation and transit services in the region. Board members reviewed the summary. Mr. Padgett made a motion to approve the resolution to adopt the 2025 South Central Alabama Human Services Coordinated Transportation Plan; Mr. Davis provided a second. The resolution was unanimously approved.

Jennifer Kilpatrick presented the Aging Report. Ms. Kilpatrick reviewed the 2026-2029 SCADC Area Plan on Aging, stating that the plan is updated every four years and that a copy is available on the agency website for comment until Friday, August 29, 2025. She described the process in developing the plan regarding surveys and public hearings. She further stated that the plan includes goals, objectives, strategies and outcomes, along with a demographic and health profile for each county. Judge Tate made a motion to approve the 2026-2029 SCADC Area Plan on Aging, as presented; Mr. Hutchison seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Ashton Hutchison provided a report on Planning and Economic Development, stating that each Board Member had a copy of the agency's current work program. She informed the board that staff members had recently submitted numerous applications on behalf of member governments through Southeast Crescent Regional Authority, Delta Regional Authority and the Community Development Block Grant Program. She

further stated that staff members are now working on applications for Land and Water Conservation Fund, Recreational Trails Program, and the Appalachian Regional Commission. It was noted that the project management funds had increased about \$20 million since last year to \$72 million. Mr. Howard noted that these project management funds are in addition to the agency budget funds that staff members manage for local governments.

Mr. Howard gave the Director's Report and provided a statewide outlook on funding programs. He then thanked everyone in attendance for being there.

With there being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.







Unmet Transportation Needs and Strategies

Listed below are the unmet transportation needs and issues that have been identified during the process of updating the 2025 South Central Alabama Human Services Coordinated Transportation Plan. Each need is followed by a list of strategies, with priority strategies in bold face italic type.

UNMET NEED: Services to Special Need Populations

- Expand existing services to senior citizens and disabled persons to reach those citizens that are not currently served.**
- Expand existing services to accommodate other errands while traveling for nutritional purposes.**
- Expand existing services to meet the needs of low-income persons through fee reductions and increased service.**
- Identify special needs persons and groups of population within each county, with particular emphasis on how to transport them in an emergency event.

UNMET NEED: Removal of Employment Barriers

- Work with major employers to initiate incentive programs for carpooling and ride-sharing.**
- Reach unemployed persons in terms of location and awareness of services. Transportation services cannot continue to be the barrier to employment.**
- Establish transportation for employment that extends beyond county boundaries.
- Specifically target transportation system expansion to meet the needs of local and nearby employers in terms of location and hours, including shift work.

UNMET NEED: Existing Transportation Infrastructure


- Identify existing road conditions that limit the provision of continuous transportation services in rural areas.**

Look at long-term road improvements and extensions that will minimize the travel distance from rural areas to centralized service providers, such as healthcare.

2025 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Since appreciation is extended to the many citizens, local governments and agencies in the South Central Alabama Region. As transportation providers and users, each of you contributed to the process of making this plan complete, if not for your willingness to answer questions, share information and ideas, and your openness to sharing and coordinating resources, it would not be possible to conceive of an improved system of the delivery of transportation services.

The purpose of the 2025 South Central Alabama and gaps in transportation and transit services have not changed much in the last 20 years since the Human Services Coordinated Transportation Plan was developed in 2006, even though (HSCTP) is to identify barriers to transportation and first HSCTP was developed in 2006, even though transit services, as well as to develop a prioritized improvements have been made. Instead, as the total list of strategies for increased coordination among population of the region continues to decrease, the both public and private transportation providers and opportunities for increased transportation services, from the same unmet transportation needs appears enacted in 2002, the Infrastructure Investment to increasing. Further, it is estimated that 5.4 percent of the occupied households in the region have no vehicle available, which equates to approximately 1,209 households. With an average household size across the region, at 2.89 persons per household, the actual number of citizens impacted by the implementation of the 2025 South Central Alabama Human Services Coordinated Transportation Plan meets the requirements of the legislation.

Areas with high transportation needs were determined based on data collected for target household, the actual number of citizens impacted by population groups: senior citizens; persons with a disability; unemployed persons; high poverty levels; and households with no vehicle available.

Not surprisingly, the target population groups are often found in the parts of our region that have the lowest population density, which only increases the need. In fact, it was discovered during the planning process that the unmet needs still, there exist the potential for 83.3 percent of the region's population to be affected by at least one unmet transportation need. This equates to a possible 85,862 people in need of a transportation service.




